What is a "Green Lab"?

Qualified Patients self-administer medical cannabis under the observation of instructors. Students administer sobriety tests on these volunteers to determine if they are impaired. After consumption, dose amounts, administration methods, and impairment indicators are documented and reviewed.

Who benefits?

Everyone who is involved in this training benefits. With legalization, law enforcement officers will contact more drivers who have used a cannabis product. This training will help officers distinguish between someone who has used a cannabis product medicinally (low doses and is not impaired) versus someone who has over-consumed.

Volunteer consumers also benefit. After speaking with our first group of volunteers, they were excited to see how field sobriety tests worked. They were also surprised officers did not automatically consider them impaired just because they had consumed. At medicinal doses, officers considered the volunteers not impaired in approximately 93% of cases.

The local community also benefits from this training. Communities want to see responsible use while their patient rights are preserved and respected. This training brings cannabis consumers and law enforcement officers together, helping them better understand each other while building relationships.



Non-Financial Sponsors

Facility tours-As part of this training, we want officers to tour Medical Marijuana Facilities. This allows officers to see the legitimacy of legal marijuana and builds relationships with cannabis industry personnel. We will also be inviting officers from other states which may not have legal cannabis programs, so they can better understand legal cannabis.

<u>Volunteers</u>-Qualified Patient Volunteers Consumers are always needed. See the volunteer guidance document link below for more information.

Consumption location-This is our biggest hurdle to overcome. State law and DHSS Rules and Regulations do not allow cannabis consumption in public places. We are seeking consumption locations owned by private entities that would allow our volunteers to consume. We are seeking consumption locations near Kansas City, St. Louis, Columbia, Springfield, and Cape Girardeau.

Financial Sponsors







The total cost for this course is \$6,000 per 20 students or \$300 per student. Some law enforcement agencies may be able to cover this cost, however, most will not.

What does the course fee cover?

Officer training

This course has been approved for law enforcement continuing educations hours. Each officer who attends will be awarded mandatory training hours. Extract-ED submits these hours to the state and maintains all necessary records.

Classroom

Due to its size, and to respect social distancing, this course demands a large training room. Typically, this involves renting 1-2 salon rooms from a local conference center.

Instructors

Each volunteer consumer must have an instructor with them at all times. These instructors assist the volunteers with anything they may need and record information during the Green Lab. Each instructor monitors the students as they administer field sobriety tests. These instructors are considered experts in their field and help ensure the training's integrity and results. In addition to paying their expenses, these instructors travel from around the state and often require overnight lodging.

Registered Nurse

A registered nurse will be on-site during consumption and throughout the Green Lab. This ensures volunteer patient consumers are observed by a medical professional who can assist them with questions or any complications.

Volunteer Transportation

Volunteer consumers will be transported by Extract-ED instructors to the classroom from the consumption site. This involves renting several vehicles large enough to fit all volunteers. Once the training has concluded, all volunteers will be provided a ride home if needed.

What does sponsoring a training mean?

We also allow cannabis personnel from these sponsors to attend the training. Sponsors will also be recognized during the classroom portion of the training. Each sponsor's logo will be displayed in the course material as a sponsor of the training. This makes law enforcement officers aware of the sponsorship from the cannabis industry.
